OPINION AND ORDER

General Cold Storage Co., a corporation, is a public utility warehouseman at South San Francisco. By this application, it seeks authority to discontinue this operation.

According to the application, applicant has been and will continue to be unable to attract a sufficient volume of patronage from the public to operate at other than a continuing loss; there is not sufficient public demand or need of such facilities at South San Francisco; adequate facilities are available at San Francisco; and there are at the present time no patrons using applicant's facilities.

Upon consideration of the allegations contained in the verified application, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity no longer require the operation of the public utility warehouse in question. The application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That General Cold Storage Co. is hereby authorized to discontinue service as a public utility warehouseman at South San Francisco as proposed in the above application, subject to the following conditions:




(a) That General Cold Storage Co. shall, within thirty days after the effective date of this order, file with the Commission its written acceptance of this order and file a cancellation of its Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 2. Such cancellation may be made on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public.

(2) That the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
