ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc. (formerly Gilliard Petroleum Service, Inc.), is certificated as a petroleum irregular route carrier pursuant to Decision No. 50315, dated July 27, 1954. Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc., has informed the Commission by letter dated August 5, 1959, that it has ceased operations and is no longer in existence. The letter states that the Commission may cancel the certificate of public convenience and necessity. In the circumstances, the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Decision No. 50315, supra, will be revoked. All effective tariffs and powers of attorney on file with the Commission by Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc., will be canceled. Therefore, good cause appearing. IT IS ORDERED: (1) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc., by Decision No. 50315, dated July 27, 1954, in Application No. 35234, is revoked. (2) That C. R. Nickerson, Agent, is authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc., from his tariffs on file with this Commission within ninety days after the effective date of this order, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public. -1-

(3) That the power of attorney issued by Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc., in favor of C. R. Nickerson, Agent, is canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Coastal Vacuum Service, Inc.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date of service.
