O P I N I O N

This phase of Case No. 5432 is one of several dealing with possible revisions of the various commodity rates, rules and regulations named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. The instant proceeding involves the rates and rules governing the transportation of rice, grain, grain products and related articles.

After due notice to persons and organizations believed to be interested, public hearings were held before Examiner William E. Turpen on March 3 and 4, April 7, 8, 9, 10 and 29, 1959, at San Francisco; on March 11, 1959, at Fresno; and on March 12, 1959, at Los Angeles. Evidence was presented by members of the Commission staff and by representatives of shippers and carriers. Other interested parties also assisted in developing the record. The matter was submitted upon the filing of a statement by the California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association on May 11, 1959.

Pursuant to petition of the California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association, and at the direction of the Commission, an examiner's proposed report was issued and served on all parties of

record. Exceptions to the proposed report were filed by California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association, California Trucking Associations, Inc., and Carnation Company and Albers Milling Company. Replies to the exceptions were filed by California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association, California Trucking Associations, Inc., The Pillsbury Company, and General Mills, Inc.

As the examiner summarized the evidence in detail in his report, it will not be necessary to review the entire record in this opinion. Only those portions of the report to which exceptions have been taken will be treated in detail herein.

The record shows that the commodity lists and rates for the commodities here involved have not had any major changes in over twenty years, although the rates have been made subject to several percentage increases which were incidental to general rate adjustments in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. A Commission engineer presented in evidence studies he had made of the cost of transporting grain and rice. Rate experts from the Commission's staff presented exhibits containing suggested revisions in the rates, rules and regulations. A number of carrier and shipper representatives offered alternative recommendations or stated their positions with respect to the various proposals.

A number of the findings and conclusions recommended by the examiner in his report were not excepted to. These involve the revision of the commodity lists, cancellation of the rates on food preparations, establishment of an exception rating on "cake mixes," elimination of special rate treatment to Imperial Valley points, and clarification of the rules pertaining to application of rates, including revision of the definition of field pickup and provision for stops in transit for inspection or diversion.

The California Trucking Associations, Inc., excepted to the examiner's conclusion that no change should be made in Item No. 143, relating to demurrage charges. The Association contends that the existing provisions are unreasonable because the charge is the same after the expiration of the free time regardless of the length of delay. In its reply to this exception, the California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association pointed out the impracticability of attempting to rely on drivers' records for measurement of the delay time. In his report the examiner stated that the provisions in question were established as result of hearings held specifically to consider that matter, and that the record in this proceeding does not contain evidence to support any changes in the item. The examiner's conclusions and recommendations will be adopted.

The California Trucking Associations, Inc., also excepted to the examiner's conclusion that rate scales for minimum weight brackets of 10,000 pounds and 30,000 pounds, as recommended by the staff rate witness, be adopted. The Association's argument is based on the allegation that these minimum weights are not adaptable to modern equipment and do not promote economic use of equipment. Furthermore, it states that specific costs were not developed for these minimum weights. Replies to this exception were filed by the California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association, by General Mills, Inc., and by Pillsbury Company. In essence, the replies point out that the evidence of record shows the need for the 10,000-pound and 30,000-pound rate scales. Although it is true that specific costs were not developed for these particular scales, the rates proposed by the staff witness are founded on basic relationships between the various scales and the record is clear that the 10,000-pound and 30,000-pound scales are needed.

A further exception by the California Trucking Associations, Inc., was to the examiner's conclusion that the added charge for field

pickup shipments should be 2 cents per 100 pounds instead of the 3 cents proposed by the Association. A review of the evidence confirms the examiner's finding that the record does not support establishing a higher charge.

Finally, the California Trucking Associations, Inc., excepted to continuation of the rice rates being subject to the rule in determining distances that the average mileage from and to San Francisco and Oakland be used. This provision recommended by the examiner results only in a continuance of the present rule, and the record contains no proposal nor evidence for a change in the present situation. The examiner's recommendation will be adopted.

The Carnation Company and the Albers Milling Company, a division of Carnation Company, excepted to the examiner's conclusion and finding that the rate scales for minimum weight brackets of any quantity, 2,000 pounds and 4,000 pounds be canceled. In its argument, Carnation Company relies on the requirement in Article XII, Section 20, of the State Constitution and in Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code that no public utility can increase its rates without a showing before the Commission and a finding by the Commission that the increase is justified. However, as pointed out in the reply filed by the California Trucking Associations, Inc., this is not a proceeding where a public utility is seeking an increased rate. We have carefully reviewed the record, including the testimony and exhibits presented by the witness for Carnation Company, and conclude that the examiner's recommendation should be adopted.

The California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association excepted generally to the examiner's recommendation that the rates proposed by the staff be adopted. In support of its exceptions, the California Hay, Grain & Feed Dealers Association repeated arguments that it had used during the course of the hearings, mainly that the proposed rates were based on cost studies that did not reflect current

operating methods and equipment, and that little or no recognition was given to the costs of proprietary operations or to the testimony of growers and dealers. We have reviewed the evidence of record, the exceptions filed by the California Hay, Grain and Feed Dealers Association and the reply thereto filed by the California Trucking Associations, Inc., and conclude that the examiner reached the proper findings and recommendation as to adopting the rates proposed by the staff. It is not necessary to discuss herein every point of exception taken to the examiner's proposed report. The evidence of record, the recommendations made by the examiner in his report, the exceptions and replies thereto have all been carefully considered. We therefore find and conclude that the revisions and adjustments in the commodity rates, rules and regulations named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for the transportation of grain, rice, grain products and related articles recommended by the examiner in the proposed report in this proceeding, and which are established in the order which follows, are justified; that the minimum rates, rules and regulations as so changed are and will be just, reasonable, and non-discriminatory minimum rates for the transportation of the commodities here involved; and that the increases required to be made or authorized to be made by said order are justified.

O R D E R

Based upon the evidence of record and upon the findings and conclusions set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D of Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective October 30, 1959, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix B, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.


2. That tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective no earlier than the effective date hereof on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, and that such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than October 30, 1959; and that tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the tariff changes herein involved.


3. That common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the increased rates authorized hereinabove, be and they are authorized to depart from the provisions of Article XII, Section 21, of the Constitution, and Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code, to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; that such outstanding authorizations be and they are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and that schedules containing the commodity descriptions published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.


4. That in all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

(b) Subject to Notes 1, 2, 3 and 4 hereof, when point of origin or point of destination is carrier's established depot, rates shall be 5 cents per 100 pounds (or 5 cents per shipment when shipment weighs less than 100 pounds) less than those specifically named herein. When both point of origin and point of destination are carrier's established depots, rates shall be 10 cents per 100 pounds (or 10 cents per shipment when shipment weighs less than 100 pounds) less than those named herein. In no case shall the net transportation rate be less than 15 cents per 100 pounds when applying the provisions of this paragraph.

NOTE 1.-No deduction from rates specifically named herein shall be made under this rule from rates based upon a minimum weight of 10,000 pounds or more, nor from minimum charges provided by Item No. 150.

NOTE 2.-No deduction from rates specifically named herein shall be made under this rule on shipments transported for persons, companies or corporations upon whose premises depots from or to which the transportation is performed are located.

NOTE 3.-When the commodity upon which charges are to be computed is rated at a percentage or multiple of classes 1, 2, 3 or 4, deductions under this rule shall be made from the resulting rate.

NOTE 4.-Deductions under this rule on split pickup or split delivery shipments shall be made only on the weight of the component parts having point of origin or point of destination, or both (as the case may be), at the carrier's established depots.
