ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

N. E. M. Lines, Inc., a corporation, possesses a highway common carrier certificate authorizing the transportation of frozen foodstuffs, beverages and dry ice between numerous points and places within the State of California.

The liability insurance policy of N. E. M. Lines, Inc., lapsed as of October 14, 1959. Evidence of liability protection required by General Order No. 100A not being on file, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such failure constitutes good cause for suspension of such certificate and of tariffs applicable to service thereunder,

IT I3 ORDERED as follows:

- (1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by N. E. M. Lines, Inc., by Decision No. 50290, dated July 20, 1954, in application No. 35515, is suspended pending further order.
- (2) All tariffs issued by or on behalf of N. E. M. Lines, Inc., are suspended pending further order. A copy of this order shall be filed with said tariffs in the office of the Commission.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon N. E. M. Lines, Inc., and to mail a copy of this order to Mr. Marquam C. George, attorney for said carrier.

The effective date of this order shall be the fifth day after such service, unless before such effective date N. E. M. Lines, Inc., shall have filed with this Commission evidence of insurance protection as required by General Order No. 100A, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
