O P I N I O N

This complaint, filed August 20, 1959, requests an order against defendant that telephone facilities be restored at Apartment 3, 91 Oriente Street, Bayshore City, San Mateo County. Decision No. 58942 ordered said facilities, with telephone number Delaware 3-6910, restored pending hearing which was held on November 20, 1959 in Redwood City, before Examiner Rowe.

After consideration of the evidence, the Commission finds that the telephone company's action was required by its tariff and based upon reasonable cause as such term is used in Commission Decision No. 41415, dated April 6, 1948 in Case No. 5761. It is further found that said telephone facilities have not been shown to have been used by complainant nor with his knowledge or consent to violate the law. Consequently, complainant is entitled to restoration of such service.


O R D E R


The effective date of this order shall be five days after the date hereof.
