O P I N I O N

H. A. Shelley, doing business as Wilmington Bus Company, requests authority to operate a passenger stage service between Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Lomita Miraleste, San Pedro, Harbor City, and Wilmington, on the one hand, and the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade and the Pasadena Rose Bowl, on the other hand. Such service to be operated on January 1st of each year only.

Applicant has been providing service for many years as a passenger stage carrier and under charter arrangements. He alleges that the proposed service will in no way compete or duplicate the service provided by any existing carriers. As a matter of convenience it is requested that applicant be allowed to operate over whichever route is most appropriate, convenient and direct between said points.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to H. A. Shelley, authorizing the transportation of passengers between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. That in providing the service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall observe and comply with the following service regulations:

- a. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of his operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 98, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
- b. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than two days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs and timetables satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

H. A. Shelley, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport passengers as a highway common carrier between the following points:

Between Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Lomita Miraleste, San Pedro, Harbor City, and Wilmington, on the one hand; and the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade and the Pasadena Rose Bowl, on the other hand.

Such service to be provided on January 1st of each year only.
