OBINION

By this application, filed September 25, 1959, Lincoln Properties, Inc., requests an order permitting it to abandon service as a passenger stage corporation, transporting passengers between the City of Stockton and Colonial Heights.

Public hearing was held on November 23, 1959, in Stockton, before Examiner Rowe. Evidence, both oral and documentary, was adduced and the matter submitted for decision.

From the evidence of record, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that although applicant is presently losing money in this operation, it has not exhausted all means of route changes or extensions, of changing or eliminating bus schedules, of requesting fare increases, or of other modifications by which it may adequately improve its earning position so that it can continue to render the essential portions of this service. The application, consequently, will be denied.

ORDER

Public hearing having been held, and based upon the evidence of record and the above findings,

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 41519 is denied.
