In the Matter of the Application of THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, a Municipal Corporation of the State of California, for permission and Authorization to Relocate and Widen crossing No. B-462.1, a highway crossing at grade across the Southern Pacific Company's railroad right-of-way (inland route) in said City.

ORDER

The City of San Fernando is authorized to construct Wolfskill Street at grade across Southern Pacific Company's El Paso Route, in the City of San Fernando, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application as amended November 30, 1959, to be identified as Crossing No. B-462.0, and Southern Pacific Company is authorized to realign and extend a side track at the proposed location as shown on Exhibit "A" attached to the application. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 50 feet and grades of approach not greater than two per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Upon completion of Crossing No. B-462.0 and its being open to use by the public, Jessie Street (Crossing No. B-462.1),

about 140 feet southeasterly, shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
