O R D E R

The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to install at Crossing No. 4-6.6, Third Street and Broadway, in the City of Oakland, Alameda County, traffic signals to operate as proposed in paragraph numbered IV and Exhibit "A" of its application, providing that both near-side and far-side cantilever traffic signals shall be installed to control vehicular traffic on Broadway.

The above mentioned crossing protection may be installed in lieu of and in substitution for two Standard No. 1 crossing signs, a crossing watchman on duty daily from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., boulevard stop signs regulating vehicular traffic on Broadway, and two cantilever type flashing red lights regulating vehicular traffic on Broadway. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion costs by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
