OPINION

Xey System Transit Lines requests authority to reroute its No. 11 Oakland Avenue Passenger Stage Line so as to operate via Broadway, 20th Street and Harrison Street, instead of via Broadway, 24th Street and Harrison Street.

It is alleged that the area in the vicinity of 20th and Harrison Streets is presently being developed to include the new Kaiser Building and the new White House retail store; that with the occupancy of these new facilities, public transportation is needed to accommodate the many employees as well as the customers and patrons of said establishments. Also, applicant states that the proposed rerouting has the approval of the City of Oakland.

After consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing is not necessary.

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Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

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IT IS ORDERED:

1. That a certificate of public convenience and necessity, is hereby granted to Key System Transit Lines authorizing the transportation of passengers as a passenger stage corporation on 20th Street between Broadway and Harrison Street, and on Harrison Street between 20th Street and 24th Street, in the City of Oakland.

2. That concurrently with the inauguration of the service authorized in paragraph 1 hereof, Key System Transit Lines may discontinue service along 24th Street between Broadway and Harrison Street, Oakland, California, and the operative right granting said authority is hereby revoked.

3. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.

4. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and shall file in triplicate and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs and timetables satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
