 izing the closing of "N" Street
 nearby in the City of Colton.

O R D E R

The City of Colton is authorized to construct "M" Street at separated grades under The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company's main line in the City of Colton, San Bernardino County, at the location as described and in the manner as shown on Exhibit "B" attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2B-3.4-B.

Clearances shall be in conformance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Upon completion of the "M" Street separation and its being opened to use by the public, "N" Street, Crossing No. 2B-3.5, shall be abandoned and effectively barricaded.

Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the City of Colton and The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans of said structure approved by the railway, shall be filed with the

Commission prior to commencement of construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs of construction and maintenance by further order.

Within thirty days after completion of the structure pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
