In the Matter of the Application of JACK P. BREEN, SR., FLORENCE G. BREEN, JACK P. BREEN, JR., and FERN JOYCE BREEN, now known as JOYCE BREEN NARUSHKO, copartners doing business under the firm name and style of "J. P. BREEN CO.", to transfer to and J. P. BREEN, INC., a California corporation, to acquire operating rights and properties as a petroleum irregular route carrier.

OPINION

Jack P. Breen, Sr., Florence G. Breen, Jack P. Breen, Jr., and Fern Joyce Breen Narushko, doing business as J. P. Breen Co., request authority to sell and transfer and J. P. Breen, Inc., a newly formed corporation, requests authority to purchase and acquire certain petroleum irregular route rights and properties.

The operative rights to be transferred were established by Decision No. 44255, dated May 26, 1950, in Application No. 31217, and transferred to the present operators by Decision No. 47280, dated June 17, 1952, in Application No. 33434. Upon the formation of the new corporation, J. P. Breen, Inc., applicants hereto entered into a written agreement whereby the assets of the partnership are to be transferred to the corporation for a consideration of \$123,029.38. Said consideration is to be paid as follows: \$50,000 initial down payment and the balance of \$73,029.38 in annual installments of \$14,600 at the rate of 4 percent per annum. No apparent value is placed on the operative rights. A depreciated value of \$86,280.97 is placed upon revenue equipment and \$36,748.41 upon non-carrier property.

Jack P. Breen, Sr., Florence G. Breen, Jack P. Breen, Jr., and Fern Joyce Breen Narushko have withdrawn or canceled, and J. P. Breen, Inc., has established as its own said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 80.

The authority herein granted to incur indebtedness will become effective when J. P. Breen, Inc., has paid the fee prescribed by Section 1904(b) of the Public Utilities Code, which fee is \$74. In other respects the effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

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
