<u>opinion</u>

This matter relates to the minimum rates which the Commission has heretofore established for the transportation of rock, sand, gravel and related commodities in dump truck equipment between points in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.

Said rates have been prescribed on four different bases: zone rates, area-to-point rates, distance rates and hourly rates. The zone rates apply for transportation between designated areas where the aforesaid took products are produced and defined delivery zones where the material is used. The area-to-point rates apply from certain of the producing areas to defined points of consumption. The distance rates apply to transportation for which zone rates or area-to-point rates have not been prescribed, and the hourly rates apply in lieu of the zone rates or the distance rates when transportation under the hourly rates is requested by a shipper.

By this petition, filed April 16, 1959, the California
Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc., seeks the extension of the zone
and area-to-point rates to apply from certain areas in the vicinity
of Upland and Etiwanda. It alleges that facilities are being
developed in such areas for the production and shipment of substantial quantities of rock products, and that the zone and area-topoint rates should be made applicable to the shipments involved in
order that such shipments may have the benefit of rates which are
particularly suited to the transportation performed. For like
reasons petitioner also seeks certain extensions of the zone and
area-to-point rates to apply from Production Area "H", an established production area near Claremont, in order to accommodate expanded marketing practices of the rock products producer there
located.

Public hearings on the petition were held before Examiner C. S. Abernathy at Los Angeles on August 10, September 22 and 30, October 16, and November 17, 1959. Evidence in support of the petition was presented by rock products producers in certain of the

areas involved, by dump truck carriers of rock products, by the secretary of the Southern California Rock Products Association, by the secretary of the San Bernardino-Riverside Counties Rock Products Association, and by petitioner's manager and his assistant. A rate expert of the Commission's staff presented certain information pertaining to the boundaries of the proposed production areas. A representative of the California Trucking Associations, Inc., and members of the Commission's staff otherwise participated in the development of the record.

The general area in which the new production facilities are located is known as the San Antonio Cone. It is a rough triangular area, about five or six miles across on a side, which has been formed by alluvium of the San Antonio Creek. Assertedly, the rock deposits which lie within the cone area are of good commercial quality, and the development of such deposits as a substantial source of supply of rock and rock products for the adjacent portions of Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties is much needed.

The Southern California Rock Products Association and the San Bernardino-Riverside Counties Rock Products Association both supported petitioner's proposals as desirable contributory steps to this end. According to the secretary of the Southern California Rock Products Association, the zone and area-to-point rates are a sound and economic method of levying transportation charges. The secretary of the San Bernardino-Riverside Counties Rock Products

The membership of the Southern California Rock Products Association and of the San Bernardino-Riverside Rock Products Association is made up of a majority of the principal producers of rock products in the counties named and in Orange County.

Association stated that experience under the zone rates has demonstrated that such rates facilitate the marketing of rock products because they constitute a known and firm basis by which the producers can accurately determine their delivery costs in advance of shipment and can make definite allowance therefor in the pricing of their products.

Testimony in a somewhat similar vein was also presented by a representative of a rock products producer having facilities located within one of the proposed production areas. This witness said that his company now engages for-hire carriers under the hourly basis of rates. He said that the zone and area-to-point rates would enable his company to enter into more stable arrangements with the carriers with whom it deals. He pointed out, furthermore, that zone rates are now available to competing rock products producers in neighboring areas, and he indicated that extension of the zone rates as petitioner proposes would permit his company to meet better the competition of those producers.

For the most part the evidence of the other witnesses who testified in this matter was submitted to provide bases upon which the sought zone and area-to-point rates may be established. The evidence which was presented in connection with the zone rate proposals consists mainly of figures representing vehicle round-trip running times per delivery from the proposed production areas to various delivery zones. Similarly, figures were presented to show vehicle round-trip running times per delivery from the production areas to the points of delivery for which area-to-point rates are sought. With respect to the area-to-point rates, much testimony was presented to show that deliveries at the delivery points

involved are accomplished in conformity with criteria which are set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 as governing the application of area-to-point rates. In presenting these data petitioner requested that zone rates and area-to-point rates be established thereon at the same levels as those of the zone and the area-to-point rates that currently apply from adjacent production areas to the same delivery zones or delivery points.

No one appeared as opposing the granting of the petition. However, the California Trucking Associations, Inc., through its assistant director of research, questioned whether such action is justified on this record. The viewpoint which he expressed in this regard is that various of the data which petitioner submitted have not been sufficiently substantiated to be adopted as bases for establishment of the sought rates. As an example of what he

By Item No. 296 Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 provides that the areato-point rates apply only to transportation which has been found by the Commission to be performed under all of the following circumstances:

a. Consignee's facilities permit receipt of shipments transported by dump truck-and-trailer units; adequate space for transfer of trailer bodies to dump trucks is available within 150 feet of dumping point of shipment.

b. Consignee has received, or expects to receive, at least 1,000 tons of rock products per year.

c. Consignee maintains personnel on duty, while transportation service is being furnished, for purposes of signing delivery tickets and other operations necessary to the receipt of shipments.

d. Consignee's facilities include space for bunker reception or stock piling of rock and/or sand in quantities of at least 50 tons at one time.

e. Average loading and unloading time per dump truck-andtrailer combination does not exceed, in total, 30 minutes per 24 tons.

considered as being a material deficiency in petitioner's presentation, the Association's representative referred to the portion of the showing dealing with the time consumed in the loading and unloading of the carriers' vehicles at the points of production and consumption, respectively. He pointed out that the showing which was made in this respect was developed largely from estimates, rather than from specific studies of the loading and unloading operations. The Associations' representative particularly questioned whether the level of the area-to-point rates which petitioner seeks is a reasonable level. This question was based on the fact that said rates were originally established by conversion of the hourly rates into equivalent tonnage rates (Decision No. 57675, dated December 2, 1958); that the hourly rates have been since increased to reflect increases which the carriers have experienced in their operating costs (Decision No. 59086, dated September 29, 1959); but that corresponding increases have not been made in the area-to-point rates. Consequently, the current area-to-point rates, and those that would apply under petitioner's proposals, are, and would be, less than the tonnage equivelents of the hourly rates which now apply.

Generally speaking, zone rates have been established heretofore for the transportation of various materials by dump truck equipment in instances where regular and substantial movements of the materials are involved. Related considerations, amongst others, are needs of the shippers for a system of transportation rates that may be readily taken into account in the marketing of their products.

Notwithstanding the representations on behalf of the California Trucking Associations, Inc., to the contrary, the zone and area-to-point rates which are the subject of this petition should be established. It appears that the shipments of rock products which are made from the proposed production areas move under substantially the same transportation conditions as those which apply to shipments of rock products that move under zone and area-to-point rates from other production areas. Clearly, in such circumstances, shippers having rock products plants within the proposed production areas should likewise have available to them the same scales of zone and area-to-point rates in order that they may ship and market their products in competition with the other producers on corresponding and nondiscriminatory bases.

With the establishment of the rates, however, certain modifications affecting the volume or level of the rates under petitioner's showing should be made. In the compilation of the traverse data (vehicle running times per round trip between producing areas and delivery zones) which petitioner submitted as a basis for the development of the sought zone rates, petitioner drew from data already of record in this general proceeding, or in antecedent proceedings. In so doing, it undertook to arrive at traverse information which would provide grounds for the calculation of zone rates corresponding in volume to those which have been heretofore prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 for the transportation of rock products in the same general territory. Pursuant to an understanding at the hearings on this petition, the traverse data were received

subject to check by the Commission's staff. Figures which were developed as a result of said check are set forth along with those of petitioner in Appendix "A", attached hereto. As this appendix shows, in a number of instances the staff's figures and petitioner's figures differ materially. It appears that where different traverse times were found by the staff, the staff's figures should be accepted as the correct representation of the applicable traverse times, and that said figures should be used in the development of the zone basis of rates which petitioner seeks. To the extent, then, that the rates reflect such differences, they would differ from those which would result under petitioner's proposals.

Effect being given in petitioner's proposals to the foregoing adjustments, we are of the opinion and find that the resultant
rates, and the related rules and regulations which petitioner also
seeks, are, and will be, just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory
minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation that
would be subject thereto. Said provisions will be incorporated in
Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 by the order which follows. To this extent
the petition will be granted.

ORDER

Based on the evidence of record and on the conclusions and findings in the preceding opinion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566, as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 22, 1960, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix "B", also attached hereto, which pages and appendix are made a part hereof by this reference.

- 2. In all other respects, said Decision No. 32566, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
