## ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

HOMER D. BRUNER of 417 East Sixth Street, Los Angeles, California, having filed a verified complaint, alleging in substance that he is the owner of a restaurant located at said address; that prior to April 5, 1960, complainant was a subscriber and user of a coin box telephone service with an extension in the kitchen furnished by defendant under number MAdison 9-9463, at said address; that on April 5, 1960, the Los Angeles Police removed the extension telephone service and arrested complainant on a charge of suspicion of bookmaking; that on April 22, 1960, the telephone facilities of complainant were terminated by the defendant pursuant to instructions from the Los Angeles Police; that said telephone facilities never were used as instrumentalities to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation; that complainant has made demand upon defendant to have the said telephone facilities restored, but defendant has refused to do so; that complainant is suffering irreparable damages to his business and

reputation and will continue to suffer such hardship if deprived of said telephone facilities.

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph
Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainant pending hearing on said complaint or further Commission order
thereon, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed
tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be
set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such
time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

- 1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply to said complaint within ten (10) days after said service.
- 2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to defendant.
- 3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
