## ORDER AMENDING DECISION AND DENYING REHEARING

James L. Chase, doing business as Kern Valley Transfer, having filed a petition for rehearing and reconsideration of Decision No. 59655, and the Commission having considered said petition and each and every allegation therein, and it appearing that although a finding of dedication of property to a public use is implicit in the findings in said Decision that the Petitioner has operated as a highway common carrier between certain designated points, a specific finding of dedication to affirm that fact would serve to clarify the Decision and Order;

IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 59655 is hereby amended by adding the following sentence at the end of the third full paragraph appearing on page 13 of said Decision:

"The Commission further finds that by such conduct and operations, respondent has unequivocally manifested its intent to dedicate its property to a public use as a highway common carrier between the fixed termini here designated."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, good cause for rehearing herein not having been made to appear, in all other respects Decision No. 59655 is affirmed and the petition for rehearing denied.
