OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common, highway contract and city carrier permits. Decision No. 58494, dated May 22, 1959, in Application No. 41039, authorized it, as a city carrier, to charge less than the established minimum rates in connection with the transportation of green coffee for Hills Bros. Coffee, Inc., from piers on the San Francisco waterfront to the coffee company's plant in San Francisco. The authorized rate is 9 cents per 100 pounds, subject to a minimum weight of 1,000 tons per calendar month, the monthly tonnage averaged over twelve calendar months. The authority is scheduled to expire June 20, 1960.

By this application, filed April 22, 1960, authority is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period, but to increase the authorized rate to 10 cents to correspond with a similar increase effected in the minimum rate in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A on November 1, 1959.¹

According to the application, there has been no change in the circumstances requiring special rates for the transportation of the commodity involved. The application states that the volume of traffic and the traffic flow are substantially above the minimum requirements applicable to the outstanding authority. It is alleged

that the currently authorized rate has been and is now compensatory, and that insofar as can now be foreseen the sought rate will continue to be satisfactory and produce a reasonable profit for the ensuing year.

The application shows that on or about April 20, 1960, a copy was served on the Draymen's Association of San Francisco. No objection has been received to its being granted. The Transportation Division staff has reviewed the application and has recommended that it be granted.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rate is reasonable and consistent with the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

> Therefore, good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company is hereby authorized to transport green coffee for Hills Bros. Coffee, Inc., from piers on the San Francisco waterfront to the coffee company's plant in San Francisco, at a rate less than the minimum rate established for such transportation but not less than ten cents per 100 pounds, minimum weight 1,000 tons per calendar month, the monthly tonnage to be averaged over twelve calendar months commencing with the month in which the property is first transported.

(2) That the authority herein granted shall expire June 20, 1961, unless sconer canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.
