ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Applicant Alfred J. Barbero, doing business as Barbero Truck Lines, holds a certificate as a highway common carrier of Lumber pursuant to Decision No. 51772 issued August 2, 1955, in Application No. 36115. By the application herein, applicant has requested an order authorizing him to abandon his operations under the said certificate. He states that public convenience and necessity no longer require his operation as a common carrier of lumber from the points of origin which he is authorized to serve under said certificate.

After consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and finds and concludes that public convenience and necessity no longer require the operations of Alfred J. Barbero as a highway common carrier pursuant to said Decision No. 51772. The certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Decision No. 51772 will be revoked and all effective tariffs and powers of attorney on file with the Commission by Alfred J. Barbero will be canceled.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) On the effective date of this order the operating authority and the duty to serve of Alfred J. Barbero, as determined by Decision No. 51772, dated August 2, 1955, is revoked.

(2) All tariffs presently on file with this Commission in applicant's name are canceled.

(3) William M. Larimore, agent, is authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Alfred J. Barbero in San Francisco Movers Tariff Bureau Distance Table No. 4, Cal. P.U.C. 1, of William M. Larimore, agent.

(4) Power of Attorney AF1 No. 2 issued by Alfred J. Barbero in favor of William M. Larimore is hereby canceled.

The Secretary of the Commission is hereby directed to cause certified copies of this order to be served upon Alfred J. Barbero and William M. Larimore.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
