## ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Bekins Van Lines, Inc., and Lyon Van Lines, Inc., possess certain certificates as highway common carriers for the transportation of used household goods and personal effects and related articles. Subsequent to the enactment of the Household Goods Carriers' Act, upon the applications of these carriers, the Commission suspended the operation of their highway common carrier

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certificates (Decision No. 55020, dated May 21, 1957, in Applications Nos. 38454 and 38780, 55 Cal.P.U.C. 607).

By letters dated March 28, 1960, and May 3, 1960, Lyon Van Lines, Inc., and Bekins Van Lines, Inc., through their attorney, now request that the suspensions be made permanent or that their certificates of public convenience and necessity and tariffs be revoked.

In the circumstances, the certificates of public convenience and necessity will be revoked, and the tariffs canceled.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted Lyon Van Lines, Inc., by Decision No. 33006, dated April 16, 1940, in Application No. 22588, is hereby revoked.

(2) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted Bekins Van Lines, Inc., by Decisions Nos. 33013, dated April 16, 1940, and 33694, dated December 3, 1940, in Application No. 22480, is hereby revoked.

(3) That T. A. L. Loretz, Agent, is authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Lyon Van Lines, Inc., and Bekins Van Lines, Inc., from his tariffs on file with this Commission, for the transportation of used household goods and personal effects and related articles, said cancellation to be made within 90 days after the effective date of this order, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary is directed to cause personal service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Lyon Van Lines, Inc., upon Bekins Van Lines, Inc., and to mail a copy of this order to T. A. L. Loretz, Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be the twenticth day after service thereof upon Lyon Van Lines, Inc., and Bekins

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Van Lines, Inc., unless before such effective date they shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order denying the facts set forth herein, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
