ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Applicant Charter Bus Transportation System was authorized to operate a passenger bus service in the City of Los Angeles by Decision No. 57119, issued August 5, 1958, in Application No. 39962. By the application herein, applicant has requested authority to cease operations as of midnight on June 30, 1960, over the routes and in the areas set forth in said Decision No. 57119. The statement attached to the application shows that there is not a sufficient demand for the service and that it is financially impracticable to operate the service. The pro forma operating statement for the period April 12, 1960 to May 11, 1960 shows revenues of \$492.55, expenses of \$10,790.00 and a loss of \$10,297.45.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and finds and concludes that public convenience and necessity no longer require the operations of Charter Bus Transportation System as a passenger stage pursuant to Decision No. 57119. The certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by said Decision No. 57119 will be revoked and all effective tariffs on file with the Commission pertaining to operations by Charter Bus Transportation System pursuant to said Decision No. 57119 will be canceled. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore good cause appearing, ✓

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) As of midnight on June 30, 1960, the operating authority and the duty to serve of Charter Bus Transportation System, applicant herein, as determined by Decision No. 57119, dated August 5, 1958, is revoked.

(2) Applicant, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, effective concurrently with the discontinuance of service herein authorized, shall amend its tariffs and timetables to reflect the action taken herein. ✓

(3) Applicant shall give not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public of its discontinuance of service pursuant to this order.

The effective date of this order shall be June 21, 1960.
