OPINION

Max Rudolph, doing business as Max Rudolph Trucking, requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a public utility warehouseman of fertilizer in the City of Santa Paula.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Carter R. Bishop at Santa Paula on May 27, 1960.

The property on which the utility warehouse operations are proposed to be conducted is located at 1313 Ventura Street. The building is of concrete construction and measures 160 x 50 feet, reflecting a storage area of 8,000 square feet.

Applicant has engaged in the for-hire trucking business for many years. Incidental thereto he has performed a so-called private or contract warehouse service. The latter business has been confined principally to the storage and handling of fertilizer.

Applicant proposes to file rates which will be competitive with those of existing warehouses in the Santa Paula area.

As of December 31, 1959, applicant indicated a net worth of \$232,388.

No one appeared in opposition to the granting of the sought authority.

Upon consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought.

ORDER

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Max Rudolph, authorizing the operation of 8,000 square feet of warehouse space in the City of Santa Paula for the storage of fertilizer as a public utility warehouseman.
- (2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
 - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
 - (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice

to the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

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
