 for permission to relocate a public  
 highway crossing over the Southern  
 Pacific Company right of way and  
 tracks on Quartz Avenue at a point  
 approximately 107 feet northerly of  
 the intersection of Quartz Avenue and  
 Independence Avenue within the said  
 City of South Gate.

O R D E R

The City of South Gate is authorized to construct Quartz Avenue at grade across a spur track operated by Southern Pacific Company in the City of South Gate, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. BK-491.8-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 30 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B), with reflex reflecting sheet material.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
