Application of the City of San Buena-
 ventura, California, for an order
 authorizing construction of a crossing
 at separated grades between the main-
 line tracks of the Southern Pacific
 Company and Seaward Avenue in the City
 of San Buenaventura.

ORDER

The City of San Buenaventura is authorized to construct Seaward Avenue at separated grades under Southern Pacific Company's Coast Route in the City of San Buenaventura, Ventura County, at the location as described and in the manner as shown in the application, as amended June 13, 1960, to be identified as Crossing No. E-399.4-B.

Grade separation for Seward Avenue has been established as Priority No. 12 by Decision No. 59416 in Case No. 6244 pursuant to Statutes 1957, Chapter 2091.

Clearance shall be in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Applicant is further authorized to construct a shoofly and trestle around the construction site in the manner as shown in the application and Southern Pacific Company is authorized to operate trains thereon. Upon return of the tracks to their original alignment, the shoofly and trestle shall be abandoned and removed. Upon completion of Crossing No. E-399.4-B and its being opened to use by the public, the private crossing approximately 100 feet easterly, for temporary access to a packing plant, shall be abandoned and effectively barricaded.

Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties, and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans approved by the railroad shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days after the effective date of this order. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs of construction and maintenance by further order.

Within thirty days after completion of the structure, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
