OPINION AND ORDER

This matter was duly noticed and called for hearing on July 14, 1960, at San Diego, before Examiner Mark V. Chiesa. Applicant's attorney appeared and stated that he has not been able to contact his client, Donald E. Dillman, applicant herein, for several months, and that he had been informed by applicant that the latter was seeking financial backing for this enterprise. No evidence, necessary for the consideration of the application, was presented.

Protestants moved that the application be dismissed for lack of showing in justification for granting a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

The Commission having considered the matter and being fully advised in the premises is of the opinion and finds that applicant is unable to proceed with the application and therefore, IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 41887 of Donald E. Dillman be and it hereby is dismissed, without prejudice.
