ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The above-entitled complaint was filed on June 3, 1960, requesting an order for the restoration of telephone service at 2306 South Union Avenue, Los Angeles. On June 20, 1960, the Commission issued Decision No. 60273, herein, wherein it ordered that the telephone service be reinstalled pending a hearing on the matter.

A public hearing was held on this matter in Los Angeles before Examiner Kent C. Rogers on August 10, 1960.

Complainant Samuel Grant was present with his counsel, and it was developed that the telephone service of the complainant had never been disconnected by the telephone company for the reason

that no law enforcement agency had ever requested a removal of the telephone pursuant to this Commission's Decision No. 41415, dated April 6, 1948, in Case No. 4930 (47 Cal. P.U.C. 853), and that the telephone company had therefore replaced the telephone instrument which had been removed by police officers on or about May 26, 1960. It therefore appearing that the complainant herein has the telephone service requested by him,

IT IS ORDERED that the complaint herein is dismissed.
