In the Matter of the Application of PRICKETT TRANSPORTATION CO., a corporation, for an expansion and restatement of its certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing highway common carrier service.

Application No. 42383 (Amended)

OPINION

This application, as amended August 13, 1960, was filed June 21, 1960, and seeks to expand applicant's authority to include all of the Los Angeles Basin Territory and all of the San Francisco Territory, both as defined hereinafter in the order which follows, and to include Los Banos as a service point.

Public hearing was held in San Francisco before Examiner
Rowe on August 23, 1960. Evidence both oral and documentary was
adduced and the matter was duly submitted for decision. Competitors
were notified, but none appeared in protest.

According to the evidence of record this proposed expansion will permit applicant to better meet the requirements of its shippers, and will in no way adversely affect any competing highway common carrier. The Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that applicant be granted the authority it seeks. This will be accomplished by revoking the operative rights of applicant issued by Decisions numbered 56720, 57508 and 57113 in Application No. 36400 and issuing new operative rights as herein requested.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

ORDER

A public hearing having been held and based upon the evidence therein adduced,

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Prickett Transportation Co., a corporation, authorizing the transportation of property as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code between the points and over the routes as set forth in Appendices A, B and C attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof.
- 2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
 - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the

Commission's General Order No. 99 and insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100-A. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Orders Nos. 99 and 100-A, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days'
 notice to the Commission and to the public,
 applicant shall establish the service herein
 authorized and file in triplicate and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.
- The operating authority granted by Decisions numbered 56720, 57508 and 57113 in Application No. 36400 is hereby canceled and revoked, said revocation to become effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 2(b) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Prickett Transportation Co., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized as a highway common carrier to transport property as follows:

(1) FOODSTUFFS, BEVERAGES OR BEVERAGE PREPARATIONS NOT NAMED IN OTHER MORE SPECIFIC GROUPS, as listed under that heading in Items Nos. 39690 through 39730, 39790, and 40360 through 40440 of Western Classification No. 76, J. P. Hackler, Tariff Publishing Officer, on the issue date thereof,

BETWEEN:

Ripon, points in Stanislaus County, and Los Banos, on the one hand, and Stockton, and points in San Francisco Territory, as described in Appendix B attached hereto, and points in Los Angeles Basin Territory, as described in Appendix C attached hereto, on the other hand.

NOTE: The authority herein granted does not authorize transportation between San Francisco Territory and Los Angeles Basin Territory, nor does it authorize service to intermediate points.

(2) GLASSWARE, as listed under that heading in Items Nos. 46280 through 46315 of Western Classification No. 76, J. P. Hackler, Tariff Publishing Officer, on the issue date thereof,

BETWEEN:

Los Angeles, on the one hand, and Ripon and points in Stanislaus County, on the other hand.

NOTE: No service to intermediate points is authorized by this paragraph.
