In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the construction at grade of a spur track across and along Shafter Avenue and across Griffith Street, in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California.

ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across and along Shafter Avenue to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. E-4.81-C, and across Griffith Street, to be identified as Crossing No. E-4.88-C, both being in the City and County of San Francisco, at the locations described in the application. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the avenue and street, respectively, now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one per cent. Protection shall be by existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) at Crossing No. E-4.81-C; and by two Standard No. 1 crossings signs (General Order No. 75-B) at Crossing No. E-4.88-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked ar modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.
