<u>o p i n i o n</u>

A public hearing was held in the above-entitled matter before Examiner Thomas E. Daly on October 11, 1960, at San Francisco.

The record indicates the following: That Dorothy De Cot also known as Dorothy Langlais whose address is 4012 - 22nd Street, San Francisco, was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under number VA. 4-8616; that on or about May 31, 1960, defendant, acting upon receipt of a letter from the Chief of Police of the City and County of San Francisco, disconnected and removed said telephone facilities on the grounds that said facilities were being used for the purpose of bookmaking; that pursuant to an interim order of this Commission signed August 30, 1960, defendant was ordered to restore telephone service to complainants pending hearing; that complainant Dorothy Langlais pleaded guilty in the Superior Court in and for the County of San Francisco, received a fine and suspended sentence; that her busband, Rodney V. Langlais, had no knowledge of

such activities and the restored service is in his name; that complainants are in serious need of a telephone for their residence due to the illness of Mrs. Langlais' mother; and that there is no way to contact the children of complainants in case of illness or any emergency.

After consideration, the Commission finds and concludes that defendant herein acted upon reasonable cause in discontinuing complainants' telephone service and that the restored service in the name of Rodney V. Langlais should be made permanent.

ORDER

A complaint having been filed and the Commission being advised in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 60635 ordering temporary interim relief be made permanent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
