OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier, highway contract carrier and city carrier permits. By Decision No. 60134, dated May 17, 1960, in Application No. 42184, he was authorized under Section 3666 of the Public Utilities Code to charge less than the established minimum rates for the transportation of flavoring syrup, nonalcoholic beverages and empty containers for the Coca-Cola Company between San Francisco and certain specified northern and central California points and to transport empty pallets without charge in connection with such transportation. The authority is scheduled to expire December 2, 1960.

By this application filed October 7, 1960, applicant seeks to continue the above authority for an additional one-year period but to modify certain of the weight brackets and charges currently authorized for split delivery service.

Applicant proposes a basis of charges for split delivery service higher than those now authorized. No authority for the increase is required, inasmuch as applicant performs the transportation as a highway permit carrier for which only minimum rates have been established. Authority to assess the sought rates beyond December 2, 1960, is required, however, inasmuch as the rates are below the minimum rates otherwise applicable.

The application states that effective May 1, 1960, applicant experienced increased labor costs, but that such increases will be offset by the proposed modified split delivery provisions. Financial data submitted with the application indicates that a satisfactory return was received from the operation during the year ending August 31, 1960.

The application shows that on or about October 7, 1960, a copy thereof was served on the California Trucking Associations, Inc. No objection to its being granted has been received. The Transportation Division staff has reviewed the verified application and has recommended that it be granted.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates as specified in Appendix "A" hereof are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,
IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That John T. Lane is hereby authorized to transport flavoring syrup, nonalcoholic beverages and empty containers for the Coca-Cola Company from San Francisco to the points set forth in Appendix "A", attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, at rates no lower than those set forth in Appendix "A" hereof, in lieu of the minimum rates otherwise applicable to such transportation.
- (2) That John T. Lane is hereby further authorized to transport pallets without charge in connection with the transportation involved in this proceeding.

(3) That the authority herein granted shall expire December 2, 1961, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.
