O P I N I O N

Authority is sought to transfer a prescriptive warehouse authority conducted in Santa Ana under the name of Wright Transfer Warehouse Company to the surviving partners.

Leon G. Jump died in 1958 and pursuant to a court order signed February 20, 1959, his interest was acquired by Grace May Jump (administratrix), Robert Lee Jump and Leo L. Jump, as surviving partners.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That on or before February 1, 1961, Grace May Jump, as administratrix of the Estate of Leon G. Jump, Grace May Jump, Robert Lee Jump and Leo L. Jump may transfer and Grace May Jump, Robert Lee Jump and Leo L. Jump may acquire the prescriptive authority authorizing warehouse operations in Santa Ana.

2. That on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicants shall amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission, naming rates, rules and regulations governing the warehouse operations here involved, to show that Leon G. Jump, Grace May Jump, Robert Lee Jump and Leo L. Jump have withdrawn or canceled, and that Grace May Jump, Robert Lee Jump, and Leo L. Jump have adopted or established as their own, said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
