ORDER DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION






WHEREAS an order of investigation on the Commission's own motion was filed September 23, 1958, because of the hazardous appearance of three grade crossings in the Town of Emeryville and the failure of Southern Pacific Company and said town to reach an agreement with respect to the abolishment or protection thereof; and

WHEREAS the Commission staff now reports that all of said crossings have been adequately protected with Standard No. 8 Flashing Light Signals supplemented with automatic crossing gates pursuant to a contract executed by said parties; and

WHEREAS the purpose of said order of investigation has been fully accomplished;

NOW THEREFORE, this proceeding as instituted in Case No. 6181 is hereby ordered discontinued as of the following date.
