O P I N I O N

By Petitions for Modification Nos. 194, 195, 196 and 198,
 in Case No. 5432, Norton Company, Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing
 Company, Behr-Manning Co., and The Carborundum Company, respectively,
 seek the establishment of a fourth class exception rating on abrasive
 grinding wheels and on abrasive paper or cloth.¹ The proposed rating
 would be published in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 and would apply on
 less-than-carload and less-than-truckload shipments. Minimum Rate
 Tariff No. 2 names minimum state-wide class rates.

 the rating for all three commodities.

Public hearing of the petitions was held on a common record before Examiner Carter R. Bishop at San Francisco on October 6, 1960. Evidence in support of the respective petitions was presented through the general traffic managers of the respective petitioners. Representatives of California Trucking Associations, Inc., and of the Commission's Rate Branch staff assisted in the development of the record through examination of the witnesses.

Norton Company manufactures its abrasives at certain eastern points and at Santa Clara, California, from which it makes intrastate shipments to California consumers. The plants of the three other petitioners are located at eastern points. California intrastate distribution of these concerns is made from warehouse facilities at San Francisco, Mountain View or Los Angeles. The bulk of California intrastate movements of the commodities here in issue, the record indicates, are made by the petitioners herein. The preponderance of such movement is in less-than-carload quantities and is mostly via truck.

The record also shows the following: abrasive paper and abrasive cloth compete in the market with paint removers and with buffing or polishing compounds, all of which are subject to an exception rating of fourth class in California intrastate commerce. The densities of the aforesaid cloth and paper reflect weighted averages, for the three petitioner shippers, of 34, 38 and 40 pounds per cubic foot, respectively. Shipments of abrasive wheels average 48 and 50 pounds, respectively, for the two petitioners which ship that commodity.

The record also shows that in other respects the transportation characteristics of the subject commodities are highly favorable. As a consequence, the claim payments for loss or damage during representative periods have been nonexistent or negligible.

The values of record, with respect to abrasive paper and cloth, range from 14 cents to 136 cents per pound, with weighted averages (for two of the petitioners) of 95 cents and 102 cents. Abrasive wheels reflect values ranging from 37 cents to 74 cents per pound. The values of the paper and cloth, while exhibiting a wider range than those of competing articles, the record shows, are fairly comparable with the latter.

On interstate shipments of the commodities here in issue, moving from or to California, or on shipments moving generally elsewhere in the country, the applicable less-than-carload rating, the record discloses, has long been Class 55, which is 55 percent of first class.² Witnesses for petitioners pointed out that under the Commission's minimum rate structure fourth class rates, herein sought to be made applicable on intrastate shipments of said commodities, reflect a relationship of 70 percent of first class.

No one opposed the granting of the petitions.

The evidence is persuasive that a rating of fourth class for the transportation of less-than-carload and less-than-truckload shipments of abrasive grinding wheels and of abrasive cloth or paper in California intrastate commerce would be reasonable. Upon careful consideration of the evidence of record, the Commission is of the opinion and hereby finds that the petitions herein should be granted.

Inherent in the petitions is relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Article XII, Section 21, of the Constitution of the State of California and Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code, in order to permit the application of the sought rating to rates which are nonintermediate in application. For the reasons that departures from the above statutory provisions were authorized for the rates, like authority is justified for application of the exception rating. Such authority will be granted.

O R D E R

Based upon the evidence of record, and upon the findings and conclusions set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective March 4, 1961, the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be filed not earlier than the effective date hereof, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the tariff pages incorporated in this order.


3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the exception rating authorized hereinabove, be and they are authorized to depart from the provisions of Article XII, Section 21, of the Constitution of the State of California, and Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code, to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; that such outstanding authorizations be and they are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and that schedules containing the exception rating published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing the long- and short-haul departures and to this order.


4. In all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
