SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

This Commission having issued Decision No. 60750, dated September 13, 1960, in Application No. 41954, and therein having authorized George C. Oertly and John W. Oertly to operate as a highway common carrier of certain specified commodities between designated points, and it now appearing that a restriction set out in said order contains an inaccurate description of the territory in which the restriction is intended to apply, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Appendix A of Decision No. 60750 is amended by incorporating therein First Revised Pages 2 and 3 in revision of Original Pages 2 and 3.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

B. Applicants are authorized to transport general commodities from all points and places in Orange County, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, to the following points and places including points and places located within 15 miles laterally of the highways named:

- (1) All points in the San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix D attached hereto.
- (2) Bakersfield and points in the Sacramento Area as described in Appendix E attached hereto.
- (3) Santa Rosa, Gilroy, Salinas, Manteca, Tracy, Byron and Porterville.
- (4) All points on U.S. Highway No. 99 between Bakersfield and Sacramento.
- (5) All points on U.S. Highway No. 40 between Sacramento and San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix D attached hereto.
- (6) All points on U.S. Highway No. 101 between Gilroy and San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix D attached hereto, and between said Territory and Santa Rosa.
- (7) All points on State Highway No. 152 between Califa and Gilroy.
- (8) All points on U.S. Highway No. 50 between Manteca and San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix D attached hereto, and on the unnumbered county road between Tracy and Byron.
- (9) All points on State Highway No. 4 between Stockton and San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix D attached hereto.

C. The authorities hereinabove set forth in Paragraphs A(1) (c), A(2), and B(1) through (9) do not include the right to render service to, from, or between intermediate points from Santa Ana to Bakersfield or from Santa Ana to Gilroy, on shipments destined to the San Francisco Territory, Fresno, Modesto, or the Sacramento Area; or to, from, or between intermediate points from the San Francisco Territory,

Fresno, Modesto, or the Sacramento Area to Santa Ana; or between the Los Angeles Territory and the San Francisco Territory; or between points in Orange County and Bakersfield or Gilroy.

D. Applicants shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
5. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
6. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
7. Logs.
