Decision No. 51477

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Application of the County of Riverside,
 a political subdivision of the State of
 California, having corporate powers, for
 an order to construct an overhead cross-
 ing for a public highway known as Ramon
 Road over the tracks and right of way
 of Southern Pacific Railroad Company.

O R D E R

The County of Riverside is authorized to construct Ramon Road at separated grades over Southern Pacific Company's El Paso Route, in Riverside County, at the location described and in the manner as shown on Exhibit "A" attached to the application to be identified as Crossing No. B-598.1-A.

Clearances shall be in conformance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D and Decision No. 50807, dated November 30, 1954.

Applicant is further authorized to construct a temporary detour road around the construction site and at grade across said Southern Pacific Company track at the location substantially as shown in the application. Construction of the crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72 and not less than 24 feet in width with grades of approach not greater than three percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B). Crossing shall be identified as Crossing No. B-598.05, Ramon Road Detour. Upon completion

of Crossing No. B-598.1-A and its being opened to public use, Crossing No. B-598.05 shall be abandoned and closed.

Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans approved by the railroad, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencement of construction.

Within thirty days after completion of the detour crossing, its closure, and completion of the separation structure, pursuant to the order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
