Application of the State of California,
 Department of Public Works, for an order
 authorizing alteration of the Escobar
 Street grade crossing over the industrial
 spur track of the Southern Pacific Company
 leading to the Shell Oil Company plant in
 the City of Martinez, Contra Costa County.

ORDER

State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to alter Escobar Street at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Martinez, Contra Costa County, at the location described in the application identified as Crossing No. B-35.9-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than forty-four feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals, supplemented by two cantilever flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be

extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
