ORDER OF MODIFICATION

By Decision No. 61321, applicant was authorized to discontinue the transportation of "liquid fertilizer and sugar in bulk" as a highway common carrier. For purposes of clarification said authorization should be amended to read "liquid fertilizer and liquid sugar in bulk in tank truck equipment."

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IS IS ORDERED:

(1) That ordering paragraph (1) of Decision No. 61321 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) That Francis Earl Blincoe may discontinue transporting liquid fertilizer and liquid sugar in bulk in tank truck equipment as a highway common carrier."

(2) That Second Revised Page 3 attached hereto is substituted in the place and stead of First Revised Page 3 of Appendix A attached to Decision No. 60184.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

B. Francis Earl Blincoe shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerator equipment.
5. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
6. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
7. Logs.
8. Liquid fertilizer and liquid sugar in bulk in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers, or a combination of such highway vehicles.
