SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 60098 in the above-entitled proceeding, the Commission on May 9, 1960 found respondent James A. Hurley, doing business as Hurley Trucking Co., in contempt of the Commission in that having the ability to do so, he had failed to comply with the terms of and was in violation and disobedience of the Commission's decision and order in Decision No. 56314 herein.

By said Decision No. 60098 the Commission ordered that respondent pay a fine of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), which fine was suspended upon the condition that respondent submit to the Commission on the first Monday of each month a report of the undercharges collected and specifying the action taken on charges remaining to be collected.

Respondent has failed to satisfy the condition of filing said reports, in that he has failed to make timely filings of the reports due on the first Monday of November, 1960, and the first Monday of December, 1960; and the report which should have been filed on the first Monday in January, 1961 has not yet been submitted.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows: that the suspension of said fine of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for said contempt, violation and disobedience of Decision No. 60098 is hereby removed; that respondent James A. Hurley, doing business as Hurley Trucking Co., pay said fine of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to the Secretary of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California within five days after service hereof; that the Secretary is hereby directed to cause personal service of a certified copy hereof to be made upon James A. Hurley; and that this order shall become effective upon the date hereof.
