## OPINION

The Commission instituted the present investigation or September 13, 1960. Its purpose is to determine whether or not respondent has acquired a prescriptive right as a warehouseman by reason of operations conducted in good faith on September 1, 1959 under tariffs and schedules of respondent lawfully on file with the Commission. In response to the Order of Investigation, respondent has filed a letter which did not allege that it was, in fact, operating certain floor space as a public utility warehouseman in good faith on said date under tariffs and schedules lawfully on file with the Commission.

A public hearing was held before Examiner John Power at Los Angeles on December 21, 1960 at which time to appearance was made on behalf of respondent.

The matter having been submitted the Commission finds that respondent was not conducting operations in good faith on September 1, 1959 under tariffs and schedules lawfully on file with the Commission.
