FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Vista Del Camino Company, a corporation, by Decision No. 60866, dated October 11, 1960, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to acquire, construct, maintain and operate a public utility water system in portions of the community known as Marina, Monterey County, such authorization to become effective when the utility had provided, in a manner acceptable to the Commission, for the reasonable continuation of an adequate supply of water in case of failure of its present single source.

Letters and supporting documents received from the utility on November 16, 1960 and January 30, 1961 indicate that the utility has installed a second well, together with suitable pumping equipment, capable of producing 500 gallons of water per minute. The supply from the two wells is stated to be adequate to meet the minimum requirements of this Commission's General Order No. 103, at least for the present number of customers and those to be added in the immediate future, and the Commission finding that the additional well will be capable of providing service in case of failure of applicant's primary source of supply; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that compliance by applicant with ordering paragraph No. 2 of Decision No. 60866 is deemed to have been effected on January 30, 1961.

In all other respects Decision No. 60866 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
