O R D E R

San Diego & Arizona Eastern Railway Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across Alvarado Avenue in the City of La Mesa, San Diego County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 36D-13.8-C.

Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Clearances shall be in conformance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width of not less than 24 feet, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding three percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B), with reflex reflecting sheet material.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

Applicant declares that industry to be served is relocating to this site as a result of destruction by fire of its former plant at another location served by same railroad; that to comply with its former contracts, the continuation of rail service at the new site is essential at the earliest date possible.

The effective date of this order shall therefore be the date hereof.
