## ORDER VACATING SUSPENSION OF OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Decision No. 61494, dated February 14, 1961, in this proceeding, provided for the suspension of the certificate of public convenience and necessity of Moses Meiselman, doing business as Mann Trucking Co., granted by Decision No. 53447, dated July 16, 1956, in this proceeding, unless prior to the effective date of Decision No. 61494 he shall have filed with this Commission a proper and lawful freight classification as required by Sections 486 and 493 of the Public Utilities Code, in which event the order would be stayed.

On March 6, 1961, the Western Classification Committee, Agent, filed Supplement No. 22 to its Western Classification 77 reinstating Moses Meiselman, doing business as Mann Trucking Co., as a participant in said classification, effective April 17, 1961. Inasmuch as the required classification is now on file, Decision No. 61494, supra, will be vacated concurrently with the date Meiselman's perticipation in said classification becomes effective.
