ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

The certificate of insurance of Handy Motor Lines, Inc., a corporation, lapsed as of March 8, 1961. Evidence of liability protection required by General Order No. 100A not being on file, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such failure constitutes good cause for suspension of certificates and of tariffs applicable to services thereunder,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Handy Motor Lines, Inc., a corporation, by Decision No. 59494, dated January 12, 1960, in Application No. 41447, is hereby suspended pending further order.

(2) That all tariffs issued by or on behalf of Handy Motor Lines, Inc., are hereby suspended pending further order. A copy of this order shall be filed with said tariffs in the office of the Commission.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Handy Motor Lines, Inc.

The effective date of this order shall be the fifth day after such service, unless before such effective date Handy Motor Lines, Inc., shall have filed with this Commission evidence of insurance protection as required by General Order No. 100A, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
