OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 61357, dated January 17, 1961, in Application No. 42934, applicant was authorized to transport syrup and empty syrup containers for the Coca-Cola Company between specified points in southern California at rates less than the established minimum rates. The authority is scheduled to expire February 7, 1962. By this application, filed March 30, 1961, authority is sought to include flavored, non-alcoholic, phosphated or carbonated beverages in metal cans in the current authority. No changes in rates are proposed.

The application states that the new commodity will be tendered at the same time and place as the flavoring syrup now covered by the current authority, which will tend to increase the volume and efficiency of applicant's service.

Applicant alleges that the commodity sought to be added is subject to the same loading and unloading conditions as the commodities transported under its current authority; that the Commission recently authorized a carrier in northern California to provide transportation on said commodity at rates for equal distances on a parity with those proposed herein and on a parity with rates on flavoring syrup; that the granting of the relief sought will not adversely affect any other carrier or shipper; and that the rates and charges proposed will be just, reasonable and fully compensatory.

The application shows that on or about March 30, 1961, a copy thereof was served on California Trucking Associations, Inc. No objection to the granting of the application has been received. The Transportation Division staff has reviewed the verified application and has recommended that it be granted.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates, between the points specified in Appendix "A" hereof for the commodities shown therein, are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS ORDERED:


(1) That Export Forwarders, Inc., is hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of the minimum rate orders otherwise applicable to the services which it performs for Coca-Cola Company, to the extent specifically provided in Appendix "A" which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.


(2) That the authority herein granted shall, on and after the effective date hereof, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 61357, and shall expire with February 7, 1962.
