ORDER

The City of Petaluma is authorized to construct Payran Street at grade across tracks of Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company and Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, respectively, in the City of Petaluma, Sonoma County, at the locations described in the application to be identified as Crossings Nos. 67+0.7 and 5-39.2, respectively. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company and Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, respectively, shall bear maintenance costs between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 80 feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Upon completion of construction of the grade crossing, a private grade crossing of Shasta Street, approximately 1000 feet to the north, shall be abolished by physical closure to be performed by the railroads involved. Applicant shall bear the expense of the abolishment of the private crossing.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
