ORDER VACATING SUSPENSION OF OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Decision No. 61978, dated May 9, 1961, in this proceeding, provided for the suspension of the certificate of public convenience and necessity of John N. Rocha unless prior to the effective date of that decision he shall have filed evidence of adequate liability insurance, in which event the order would be stayed. The effective date of the decision was May 16, 1961, on which date the certificate became suspended. John N. Rocha filed the required evidence of insurance on May 16, 1961, retroactive to May 15, 1961. Inasmuch as evidence of adequate insurance is now on file, the order of suspension in Decision No. 61978, supra, will be vacated and the rights under his certificate to operate as a highway common carrier will be reinstated.

John N. Rocha is hereby placed on notice that operations conducted without adequate evidence of insurance on file with this Commission is a violation of General Order No. 100A. The carrier is reminded that the filing of evidence of insurance with a retroactive effective date to cover the period when evidence of insurance protection was not on file with the Commission does not meet the requirements of that general order. In the event he should


operate in the future without having evidence of liability insurance on file with the Commission, consideration will be given to possible penalty or other action.


Therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 61978, dated May 9, 1961, in Application No. 36057, is hereby vacated and set aside.
