OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 60227 dated June 6, 1960, in Application No. 42233, applicant was authorized to assess a rate of 14 cents per 100 pounds, minimum 1,000 tons per year, for unloading or segregating or unloading and segregating pool car shipments of magazines or periodicals in San Francisco for The Curtis Publishing Company. The authorized rate is lower than the established minimum rate for this service. The authority is scheduled to expire June 29, 1961.

By this application filed May 4, 1961, authority is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rate for a further one-year period.

Applicant alleges that it has performed and is performing the services involved at a profit; that the conditions under which the services are now being rendered are similar to the conditions prevailing when the authority was originally granted; and that no increased costs have been experienced since the authority was extended by Decision No. 60227, supra.

The application shows that on or about May 3, 1961, a copy thereof was served on California Trucking Associations, Inc., and the Draymen's Association of San Francisco, Inc. No objection to its being granted has been received. The Transportation Division staff has reviewed the verified application and has recommended that it be

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granted.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rate is reasonable and consistent with the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That San Francisco Warehouse Co., a corporation, operating as a city carrier, is hereby authorized to perform the services of unloading or segregating, or unloading and segregating, pool car shipments of magazines or periodicals for The Curtis Publishing Company in San Francisco at a rate less than the established minimum rate but not less than 1⁴ cents per 100 pounds, subject, however, to the condition that The Curtis Publishing Company shall tender to applicant for unloading or segregating, or unloading and segregating, a minimum of 1,000 tons of magazines or periodicals per year.

(2) That applicant is hereby exempted from the requirements of Paragraph (d) of Item No. 220 series of City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A in the performance of those services for The Curtis Publishing Company described in Paragraph (1) hereinabove.

(3) That the authority herein granted shall, on and afterJune 29, 1961, supersede the authority granted by Decision No.60227, and shall expire on June 29, 1962.

The effective date of this order shall be June 29, 1961. Dated at San Francisco, California, this <u>13^{TL}</u>day of June, 1961.

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
