O P I N I O N

Bill W. Smith, doing business as Smith Transfer and presently rendering service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of limited commodities, requests that his operating authority be suspended for a period of one year.

The operative rights were originally granted to Ernest Gilman Fairbank by Decision No. 53567, in Application No. 36508 and authorized the transportation of canned goods, caps, covers or tops, boxes and pallets between Manteca, on the one hand, and San Francisco, Oakland, Alameda and Stockton, on the other hand. Applicant acquired said rights by Decision No. 58961 dated September 1, 1959, in Application No. 41258.

It is alleged that the operation is small and all functions including that of driving are performed by applicant, who because of poor health, has been incapacitated since September, 1960.

After consideration the Commission finds and concludes that the proposed suspension would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,


IT IS ORDERED:


1. That the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Bill W. Smith by Decision No. 58961 dated September 1, 1959, in Application No. 41258, is hereby suspended for a period of one year from the effective date of this order.


2. That all tariffs issued by or on behalf of Bill W. Smith are hereby suspended for a period of one year from the effective date of this order. A copy of this order shall be filed with said tariffs in the office of the Commission.


The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
