$\underline{O P I N I O N}$

This matter relates to the minimum rates, rules and regulations in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 that govern the transportation of rock, sand and gravel in Southern California. The California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc., petitioner herein, asks that area-to-point rates which are named in the tariff be extended to apply to transportation not now subject to said rates. It also seeks the cancellation of some of said rates, and the modification of certain of the other tariff provisions.

Public hearings on petitioner's proposals were held before Examiner C. S. Abernathy at Los Angeles on January 24, 1961, and on C. 5437, F. 68, Amd. - SW

February 6 and 7, 1961. Evidence was presented by petitioner and by the Southern California Rock Products Association. A representative of the California Trucking Associations, Inc., and members of the Commission's staff also participated in the proceeding.

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The area-to-point rates which are involved herein apply to designated transportation services that are performed under more favorable transportation conditions than those which apply to the transportation of rock products generally. Said services are principally those in which the movements are between rock products producing plants and rock products processing plants; where the movements are in substantial volume; and where the loading and unloading of the carriers' vehicles are performed expeditiously. The arca-topoint rates produce lesser charges than those which would apply to the same movements under zone rates named in the tariff. Distinguishing characteristics of the transportation for which the areato-point rates are provided are as follows:

- a. Consignee's facilities permit receipt of shipments transported by dump truck-and-trailer units; adequate space for transfer of trailer bodies to dump trucks is available within 150 feet of dumping point of shipment.
- b. Consignee has received, or expects to receive, at least 1,000 tons of rock products per year.
- c. Consignee maintains personnel on duty, while transportation is being furnished, for purpose of signing delivery tickets and other operations necessary to the receipt of shipments.
- d. Consignee's facilities include space for bunker reception or stock piling of rock and/or sand in quantities of at least 50 tons at one time.
- e. Average loading and unloading time per dump truckand-trailer combination does not exceed, in total, 30 minutes per 24 tons.

At the present time Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 sets forth area-to-point rates for the movement of rock and sand from various rock products producing plants to more than 150 rock products processing plants in Southern California territory. Under petitioner's proposals said rates would be extended to about 35 additional processing plants. In connection with about 30 processing plants for which area-to-point rates are now provided, the area-to-point rate structure would be broadened by the prescription of rates to said plants from producing plants other than those from which the rates currently apply. Some of the present area-to-point rates would be canceled for the reason that the circumstances which prompted their establishment no longer prevail. Also, some adjustments in present tariff provisions would be made for clarification or to reflect changes in addresses of some of the processing plants. Stated purposes of the main proposals are the establishment of rates that will enable for-hire dump truck carriers to compete more effectively with proprietary transportation agencies for the same hauling, and thereby to increase the participation of said carriers in the traffic involved.

The showing which petitioner submitted in support of these proposals deals principally with (a) the time factors pertaining to the delivery of shipments of rock products to the processing plants for which the area-to-point rates are sought, and (b) the transportation conditions under which the deliveries are made. Petitioner's showing with respect to the time factors was developed largely from the same time data that underlie the area-to-point rates already in effect; the purpose thereof was to provide a basis upon which corresponding rates might be prescribed to the processing plants

involved herein. Through its showing relating to transportation conditions, petitioner undertook to establish that the circumstances in which rock products are delivered to said processing plants are essentially the same as those in which deliveries under present area-to-point rates are made, and that as a consequence prescription of the sought rates is justified by the similarity of transportation conditions.

The granting of the petition in this matter was supported by the Southern California Rock Products Association, whose membership consists of most of the producers of rock products in Southern California. A representative of this organization stated that the association is of the opinion that establishment of the rates which petitioner seeks would be of benefit to the rock products producers, and would result in more employment for the for-hire dump truck carriers. On the other hand, a representative of the California Trucking Associations, Inc., opposed the proposals on the grounds that they would result in rate reductions which have not been shown to be justified from a cost standpoint or of benefit otherwise to the carriers. By way of reply petitioner's manager declared that a showing of the costs of the services involved is not necessary in this instance for the reason that the issue is one of discrimination -- whether extension of the rates as sought is necessary to the maintenance of the minimum rates on a nondiscriminatory basis. Furthermore, he asserted in effect that the proposals are made as a matter of business judgment of the California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc., on behalf of its member carriers, that the carriers would be benefitted by establishment of the sought rates.

Discussion, Findings and Conclusions

The principal question herein is whether the extensions of the area-to-point rates which petitioner seeks are justified by transportation conditions--whether the services which are involved are performed in circumstances that are sufficiently similar to those that apply to the transportation that is NOW SUDJECT to area to-point rates that the rates should be made applicable to said services also. The reasonableness of the present area-to-point rates for the transportation to which they apply is not in issue. Also not in issue is the reasonableness of the rates as they would be applied to the aforesaid services. Clearly, if said services are performed under the same conditions as those applicable to the transportation now subject to the area-to-point rates, the rates should be deemed reasonable for those services also.

The evidence which was adduced relative to the transportation conditions in question was presented by witnesses assertedly having knowledge thereof as pertaining to the individual processing plants. In general, the evidence which these witnesses submitted is persuasive that said conditions are the same as those which have been referred to above as distinguishing characteristics of the transportation for which the area-to-point rates have been established.

In certain instances, however, it appears that the witnesses were not sufficiently informed concerning some of the services that the character thereof can be determined from their testimony. For example, in connection with the specification that "Average loading and unloading time per dump-truck-and-trailer

combination does not exceed, in total, 30 minutes per 24 tons," the witnesses had not made studies of the unloading times, or had not made sufficient studies, that they could establish what the average unloading times are at some of the processing plants involved. In connection with the specification that "Consignee maintains personnel on duty, while transportation service is being furnished, for purpose of signing delivery tickets and other operations necessary to the receipt of shipments," the witnesses had not developed information specifically on this point with respect to some of the processing plants, but were able to state only that said plants are open during normal working hours. These specifications, together with other of the distinguishing characteristics of the transportation for which the area-to-point rates have been prescribed, are listed in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 as controlling in the application of said rates. We believe that before the rates may be extended to transportation not now subject thereto, the tariff provisions should be applied strictly, and that there should be a clear showing that the transportation fully meets said specifications. Accordingly, we find and conclude that in the respects indicated above, the record does not support extension of area-to-point rates as sought, and that to this extent the petition should be denied.¹ In other respects we find and conclude that the transportation of rock products to the other of the processing plants for which areato-point rates are sought has been shown to be performed under the same transportation conditions as those to which the area-to-point .

rates apply, and that in the circumstances the rates should also be made applicable to the transportation of rock products to said plants. We find and conclude that such action is justified in the interest of providing nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved.

Petitioner's proposals in this matter also include a request for the extension of the area-to-point rates to apply from an additional producing plant located in Production Area J in the vicinity of the City of Ventura. It appears that rock products are transported from this plant under conditions corresponding to those applicable to like transportation from other rock products plants and the granting of petitioner's proposals in this respect is also justified.

The other tariff changes which petitioner requested-corrections of or changes in addresses of processing plants, the cancellation of area-to-point rates where the conditions upon which they were established no longer apply, and the cancellation of area-to-point rates where, in a few instances, lower zone rates for the same transportation are set forth in the tariff--all appear justified. Such changes will be made.

ORDER

Based on the evidence of record and on the findings and conclusions in the preceding opinion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566, as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective

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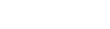

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

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
