O R D E R

The City of South San Francisco is authorized to construct Kimball Way at grade across two spur tracks of Southern Pacific Company in South San Francisco, San Mateo County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. E-10.59-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than sixty feet and grades of approach not greater than four percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflecting material.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant has scheduled construction of the crossing to be initiated as soon as possible and has requested that authorization if granted, be made effective immediately; therefore, the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
