Application of COUNTY OF YOLO to Close Existing Grade Crossing and to Construct Proposed Grade Separation Structure.

ORDER

County of Yolo is authorized to construct Fifth Street at separated grades under the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, in Broderick, Yolo County, at the location and substantially as set forth in the application, to be identified as Crossing No.A-88.2-B, subject to the condition that upon the completion of said grade separation (Crossing No. A-88.2-B) and its opening to pedestrian and vehicular traffic, the following work shall have been accomplished:

- (1) Crossing No. A-88.1 (Sixth Street), located about 400 feet westerly of the proposed separation shall be abolished by physical closing by Southern Pacific Company.
- (2) Crossing No. A-88.2 (Fifth Street), located at the proposed grade separation site shall be abolished by physical closing by Southern Pacific Company.
- (3) Crossing No. A-88.3 (Fourth Street), located about 400 feet easterly of the proposed separation shall be abolished by physical closing by Southern Pacific Company.
- (4) Crossing No. A-88.4 (Third Street) shall be protected by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75B) equipped with automatic gate arms.

Construction, abolishment and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of Crossing No. A-88.2-B approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date

hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction, abolishment and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of G. O. No. 26-D.

The above grade separation project has been established as Priority No. 10 by Decision No. 61272, in Case No. 6898, pursuant to Statutes 1957, Chapter 2091, as amended by Chapter 1763 of Statutes 1959.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
