SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Petition for rehearing of Decision No. 61844 was granted on June 20, 1961.

It is alleged in the petition that complainant provides care and attention to an infant, in her home, which makes it necessary in case of emergency to have telephone service available. Complainant seeks to have the restoration of her telephone service made permanent, without the sixty-day interruption required by Decision No. 61844.

A review of the record shows that, as a result of complainant's illegal use of said telephone, it was disconnected and she was without telephone service for more than a year prior to the filing of the complaint herein.

Based on the record and the allegations in the verified petition for rehearing, we hereby find and conclude that:

1. A further public hearing is not necessary.
2. The temporary interim telephone service ordered in Decision No. 61370 should be made permanent.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The order of Decision No. 61844 denying complainant's request for telephone service and vacating and setting aside the

temporary interim relief granted by Decision No. 61370 is vacated and set aside.

2. The order granting temporary interim relief, dated January 24, 1961, in Decision No. 61370, is made permanent, such restoration being subject to all duly authorized rules and regulations of the defendant company and to the existing applicable law; any provision of Decision No. 61844 to the contrary is overruled.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
